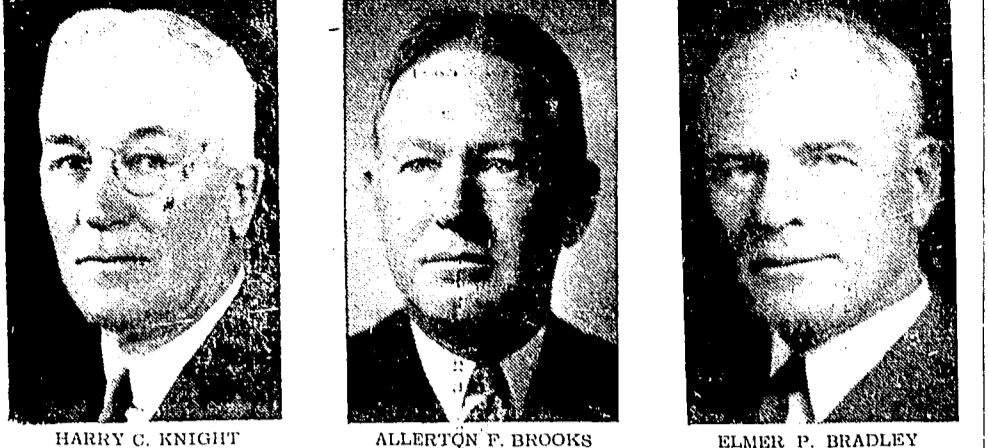

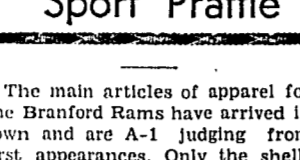

Uconns Workout Daily For Heavy Grid Slate

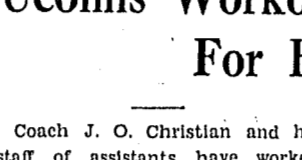

Knecht Seeks Linemen For Opening Game

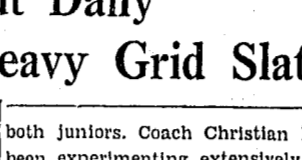
