Special Town Meeting Adjusts Teachers' Pay; Provides For Defense

Ordinance Authorizes Blackout Regulations By Selectmen—Civic Association Of Short Beach To Purchase Hollywood—\$4000 Appropriated For Defense

The special town meeting Tuesday night in the Community House was attended by about 250. Joseph H. Driscoll was chairman and Winfield R. Morgan, Clerk. All items of call were voted unanimously in the affirmative.

The first resolution was in regard to an ordinance authorizing blackout and air raid protection orders, rules and regulations; prescribing penalties for violation thereof; authorizing the Board of Selectmen to make the necessary arrangements with the proper authorities of towns and cities adjacent to and in close proximity of Branford to effect synchronization of blackouts and protection against enemy attacks or raids; and declaring an emergency.

In order to protect life and property in the town of Branford from enemy action the selectmen and the Board of Police Commissioners are authorized and directed to carry out blackouts and air raid protection measures at such times and for such periods as are ordered by the Army or Navy. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or any order, rule or regulation issued pursuant thereto shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$25. The orders, rules and regulations provided for in the ordinance are effective immediately.

The Board of Police Commissioners may appoint special police, with out pay, when essential to the preservation of life and property.

Another resolution dealt with the sale of four pieces of land with buildings in Short Beach, formerly owned by the Marvelwood Realty Co. It was voted to execute a bond for deed of the parcels of land to the Civic Association of Short Beach, acting by its Executive Board, at a purchase price of \$3000.

\$1000. will be paid upon execution of bond foreclosed and the balance payable \$500 annually. Interest at 4%.

Remarks were made by Milton P. Bradley, chairman of the Board of Education, in regard to the following resolution which was also voted in the affirmative: Resolved: That the action of the Board of Finance in appropriating and recommending that the sum of \$5,300 be appropriated for the use of the Board of Education in adjusting teachers' salaries for the current year and in laying and recommending the laying of a tax of 4-10 mills on the dollar on the assessment list of 1941.

The following resolution was also passed in the affirmative: Resolved: That the action of the Board of Finance in appropriating and recommending that the sum of \$4000, be appropriated for the use of the Civilian Defense Council for the current year and in laying and recommending the laying of a tax of 3-10 mills on the dollar on the assessment list of 1941, therefor, said tax to be collected currently with the regular tax for the year 1941-1942 be and the same is hereby ratified and approved and said appropriation is hereby made said tax is hereby laid.

Bonds amounting to \$28,000 were sold at the Branford post office during December, 1941.

Share The Books Campaign Starts Here January 12

Librarian Charles N. Baxter Appointed Regional Director To Collect Books For Soldier-Sailor Reading — Unbound Magazines Not Wanted.

Books by the million will change hands in the National Defense Book campaign starting Monday, January 12, when readers in homes throughout the land will share the books they have enjoyed with our soldiers, sailors and marines. Charles N. Baxter librarian at 17 Blackstone Memorial Library is regional director making a collection, through the libraries from East Haven to Clinton.

The campaign, sponsored by the American Library Association, American Red Cross, and United Service Organizations, seeks 10,000,000 books for U. S. O. houses, army "dayrooms," ships, naval bases, etc. Books should be taken to libraries, where they will be sorted, repaired if necessary, and sent on as quickly as possible to the spots where men in the service want books. In many communities schools and other conveniently located places will be designated as collection centers. Unbound magazines and newspapers will not be handled.

Although the government provides libraries in the large camps, the smaller units have no library at all, and even in most camps where libraries do exist, the demand for recreational reading is usually far greater than the supply. Books provided through the book campaign will thus supplement the government's existing library facilities. Men on leave—and in "offhours"—depend on the dayroom of their company and their U. S. O. house for their leisure time reading.

About the kind of books to be collected—well, what kinds of books do you like? Our soldiers and sailors have a wide range of reading interest and like those very titles, too! They are particularly eager for up-to-date technical material to help with their problems.

Aliens Directed To Take Radios To Police Dept.

The President has, by his Proclamation of December 7 and 8 1941 directed that alien enemies should not possess or use radio transmitting sets, short wave radio receiving sets or cameras, in order to carry out these regulations effectively it is necessary to require alien enemies to deposit such prohibited articles with the Law enforcement agencies.

All alien enemies having any of the above described articles are to deposit them at the Police Station between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 4:00 P. M. daily before a day to be announced by the Attorney General.

Albert Hoadley Dies Suddenly; Funeral Today

The death of Albert Eugene Hoadley of North Branford Road occurred in his home Monday at 8 P. M. following a heart attack. He was 65 years of age and was born in Branford, a son of Miles Albert Hoadley and Sarah J. Granville.

At one time he conducted a milk route in Branford, later becoming a cable splicer. At the time of his death he was employed as inspector for the M. I. F. Co. He was a member of the American Order of Junior Mechanics.

Mr. Hoadley is survived by his widow, Ellnor M. Hardick; an uncle, Alfred Granville of Branford; an aunt, Mrs. Leverett Chidsey of North Branford; and several nieces and nephews.

The funeral was held this afternoon with services in the funeral home of Norman V. Lamb, Montague Street. The Rev. A. W. Jones, of the First Baptist Church conducted the services and the burial was in Center Cemetery.

Hines Appointed With Rationing Of Auto Tires

County Comr. James F. Hines, of East Haven has been appointed by Gov. Robert A. Hurley to the committee charged with rationing automobile tires for the Northaven district. This committee may later be responsible for the control of sales of automobiles and other commodities which may be ordered curtailed by defense authorities. So far as is known the sale of tires locally will be banned except to the police and fire department, town services, such as garbage collection trucks, doctors and visiting nurses. Dealers have been forbidden the sale of tires except by order of the district committee.

New Haven county has been given a quota of 335 tires and 286 tubes for January.

ESTABLISH FIRST AID STATIONS

Dr. Arthur S. McQueen, chairman of the medical division of the Branford Civilian Defense announces that first aid stations are being set up, with 20 cots each, in Stony Creek, Pine Orchard, Center, Short Beach and Indian Neck.

A physician with nurses will be assigned to each post, in the event of an emergency. Details are being worked out and will be announced soon.

The first Regional Air Raid Warden's school opened here Tuesday evening at 7:30 in the high school. Speakers included Former-Governor Raymond E. Baldwin in "Organization for Civilian Defense" he spoke of the courage of civilians and cited British examples.

Slides accompanied a talk on communications "Air Raid Warning System" given by D. W. Loring of the telephone company.

Pictures taken of English air raids closed the first meeting which was attended by wardens and deputies of East Haven, Branford, Gullford, Madison and North Branford.

The next class will be held Friday evening at which time Herbert Gallaudet of Pine Orchard director of air warden schools and Mrs. Eleanor Rigby of Cheshire commandant of the Connecticut defense motor corps for women will address the volunteers. She is a graduate with honors of the Warden's and Motor transport division of the Mass. Women's Civilian Defense school. Allen Knight of East Haven will preside. Defense school.

Chief Air Raid Wardens in Connecticut's 169 towns were ordered today by State Defense Administrator Samuel H. Flagg to "forget formality" and appoint and assign temporary wardens to bring their organization to full strength immediately. At the same time Colonel Fisher issued an appeal to all citizens who have an hour or more to give to civilian defense to enroll as aircraft observers. He also asked all registered nurses who have changed their address since last summer to notify the State Nursing Association in Hartford of their present place of residence.

In issuing the order for full strength in the air raid warden organization immediately, Colonel Fisher said: "Don't wait a day longer. Don't wait for future wardens to be trained in schools before bringing them into your organization. Appoint them now in a temporary capacity and get them properly assigned and placed in your local organization. Then, when they have attended one of the schools, you will be able to make them full-fledged wardens. Don't stand on formality, but get to work now and bring your organization up to full strength."

Citing the fact that the thousands of men and women who now man Connecticut's 166 aircraft observation posts, reporting directly to the U. S. Army Air Corps, need relief, Colonel Fisher urged anyone with an hour a day to give to offer their services to the chief observer in their town or to their local American Legion Post commander. "The aircraft observers are the eyes and ears of our civilian defense," he said.

Legion Sponsors 1942 Oratorical Contest In E. H.

The American Legion, in cooperation with the high schools in Connecticut, will sponsor its annual oratorical tournament beginning here at East Haven with the school preliminaries, scheduled for January 13 and 14, and ending with the state-wide championship meet to take place in March.

These contestants will give extemporaneous addresses of from seven to ten minutes in length on questions of meaningful Americanism.

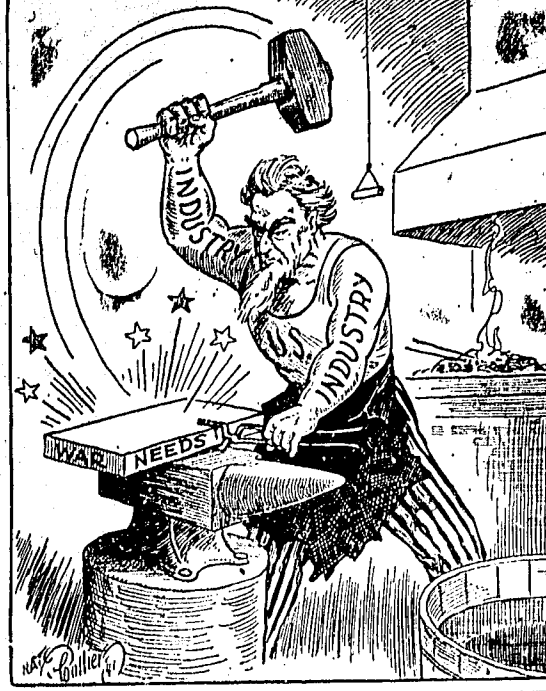

STRIKES FOR FREEDOM



SILENT DESTRUCTION

The danger of inflation that threatened us before the war is becoming more acute. If there was little time for us to take effective action to control it then, there is even less time now.

Inflation creeps up on a nation silently. But it can be as destructive as bombing planes, and once it has arrived no one is able to escape it.

What does inflation mean to the average person? It means that the value of his pay check may be cut in half—that the price of everything he has to buy may be doubled. A pound of meat may cost more than he now pays for a pair of shoes.

If we are to protect ourselves from this danger, industry must not misuse the emergency to raise prices; labor must not misuse it to demand an increase in basic wage rates; government must not misuse it to boost farm prices.

BATTLE OF THE FACTORIES

No amount of slave labor can equal the voluntary cooperation of free men. There's a fact for all of us to hang on to throughout the coming months. And it is a fact, make no mistake about it. We Americans have already proved that.

They're already hitting their stride. And more factories will join them, for this is a battle of the factories.

Undoubtedly we will have black days of discouragement, but the final battle is the one that counts in war, and we shall win it, for the spirit of freedom is still the strongest power on earth, just as it always has been.

SOMETHING TO REMEMBER

What will happen to America after the war? How will we meet our rising government debt, change our economy back to a peace-time basis and continue with our job of making America into the best place to live in the world?

Such problems are causing grave concern in the minds of many Americans at the present time. In a recent speech Dr. Robert C. Sproul, President of the University of California, pointed out some facts that should reassure us on these points.

After the war, he said, "the land and its resources will still be here; all of the knowledge of mankind from the beginning of history to the present will still be ours."

Such adjustments as we may have to make in our social and economic scheme will not destroy our democracy as long as we preserve inviolate its central and fundamental principle of respect for and recognition of the dignity and worth of individual.

That concept of the individual has always been one of the foundations of our freedom. Because of it we are able to work where we please, save our money or spend it, worship as we wish and enjoy all our other liberties.

Remember that single persons not living with husband or wife, who earn as much as \$1443 a week for the 52 weeks of the year, and married persons living together who have aggregate earnings of as much as \$2885 a week for the year, are required to file returns.

WASHINGTON SNAPSHOTS

The swirl tumult of war-time Washington have pushed twelve non-defense agencies, or parts of agencies, out of the city. Following a Presidential order, over 10,000 Government employees will have moved out of the Capital within two months.

Among the larger agencies moved out of Washington are the Patent Office and the Securities and Exchange Commission.

What effect, if any, this mass exodus will have as a decentralizing factor in executive control over the agencies affected is a subject of speculation here.

No stone is being left unturned in an effort to keep the President from being misled by the most important emergency with speed.

By unanimous action both the House and the Senate the President was given authority to:

Redistribute Government administrative functions. This, the writers of the Act hoped, would permit the agencies to indicate that aliens cannot get on with their citizenship applications as usual.

Red Cross Notes

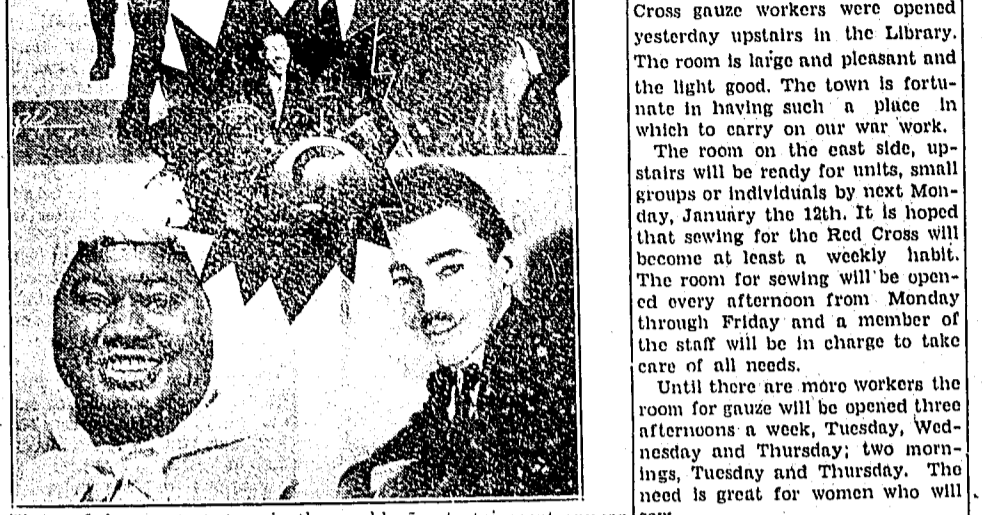

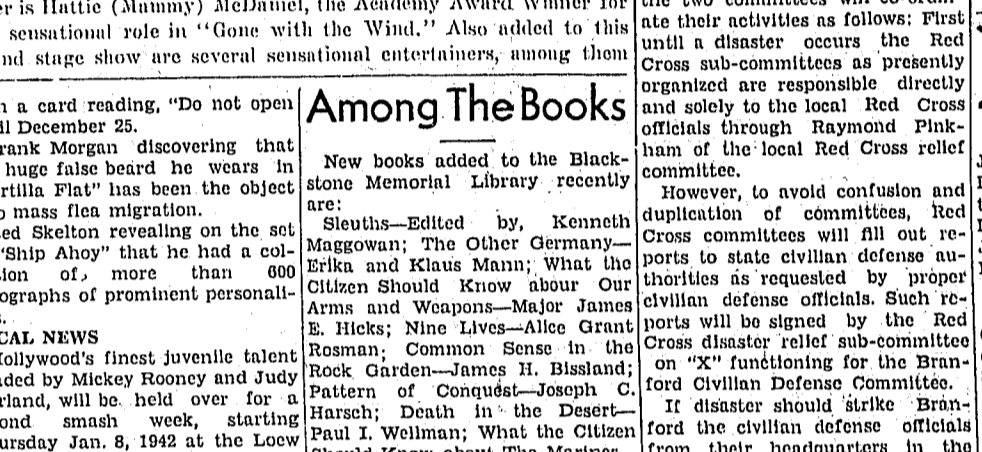
By agreement with Chairman Robert Richardson of the Civilian Defense Council and Chairman Raymond Pinkham of the Red Cross Disaster Relief Committee, the two committees will co-ordinate their activities in the following: First, until a disaster occurs the Red Cross sub-committee as presently organized are responsible directly to the Civilian Defense Council. Second, upon a disaster occurring the Red Cross sub-committee as presently organized are responsible directly to the Red Cross Disaster Relief Committee.

However, to avoid confusion and duplication of committees, Red Cross committees will all out reports to state civilian defense authorities as requested by proper civilian defense officials. Such reports will be signed by the Red Cross disaster relief sub-committee on "X" functioning for the Branford civilian defense committee. It is disaster should strike Branford the civilian defense officials from their headquarters in the Branford Post Station would immediately call on various Red Cross committees and request them to the town where, in the opinion of the Branford civilian defense committee, need for relief should exist. In such an event the Red Cross sub-committee on information, registration and relief functioning under its chairman, Mrs. Helen Barnett of the Welfare Department in the Town Hall, can be depended upon to contact and set in motion the proper Red Cross committees as requested by civilian defense officials in case they themselves should be too busy personally to contact the various Red Cross sub-committees.

The machinery of the two committees have been so coordinated that the smooth functioning of providing relief for Branford can go on efficiently no matter how many men could be inaccessible at the moment that disaster should strike.

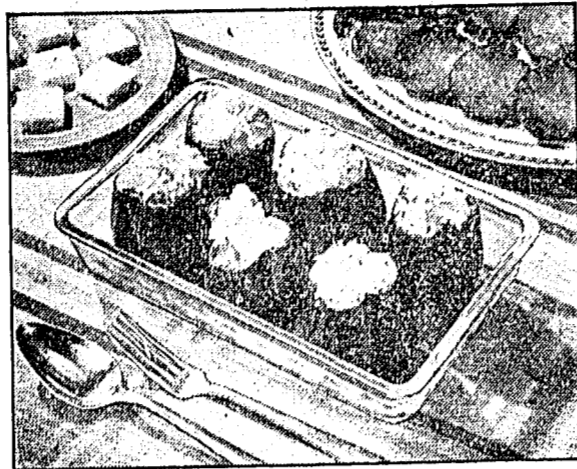

Serve Cheese Main Dish for Variety

CHEESE STUFFED GREEN PEPPERS

- 6 green peppers
 - 2 cups cooked rice
 - 1/2 cup milk
 - 2 tablespoons chopped pimento
 - 1 tablespoon minced parsley
 - 1 tablespoon grated onion
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 teaspoon pepper
 - 2 tablespoons melted butter
 - 1 cup diced American cheese
- Prepare peppers for stuffing by cutting off tops. Remove fibers and seeds. Drop into boiling salted water and simmer gently for 5 minutes. Drain. Combine cooked rice, milk, pimento, parsley, grated onion, salt, pepper, melted butter and diced cheese. Fill peppers with the cheese stuffing. Place upright in a baking pan; add 1/2 cup of hot water. Bake in a moderate oven, 350° F., for 30 minutes, or until the peppers are tender. Serves 6.

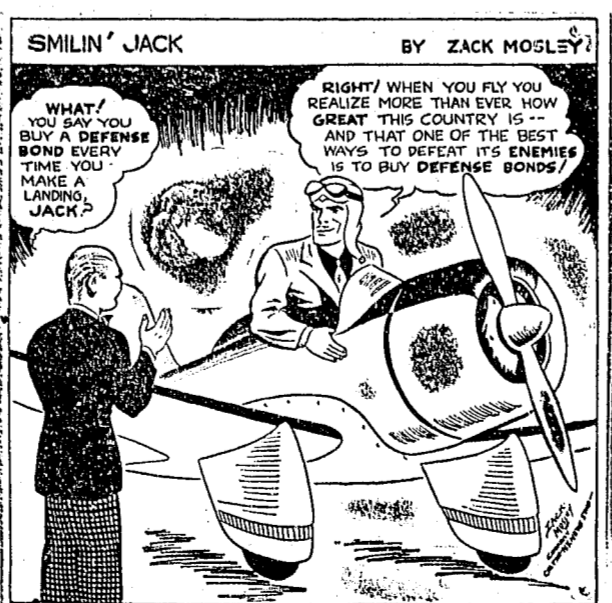
