

And Christian Belence with its "key" to the Scriptures unlocks this spiritual fact with this enlightening statement: "The universe reflects God. There is but one creator and one creation. This creation consists of the unfolding of spiritual ideas and their identities, which are embraced in the infinite Mind and forever reflected. These ideas range from the infinitesimal to infinity, and the highest ideas are the sons and daughters of God" (Science and Health, pp. 502, 503); and elsewhere Mrs. Eddy defines man in part as "the compound idea of God, including all right ideas" (15dd., p. 475), and not made up of brain, flesh, bones, nerves, blood, and other material elements.

The question might well be asked at this moment, "If God's creation, including individual man, is spiritual, what about the material universe and man which are so evident to human consciousness?" Well, friends, it is just at this point that

Christian Science begins its fundamental mission by resolving the things we see, hear, feel, smell, and taste, into the spiritual ideas or thoughts which they symbolize. The writer of the book of Hebrews points out for our further enlightenment that "things when are seen [perceived] were not made of things which do appear" (Hebr. 11:3). And so the things about us only symbolize the spiritual ideas of God's creation.

When the account of God's creation given in the first chapter of Genesis is read, we find names which mortal mind interprets materially given to the different ideas of creation, such as light, water, earth, sun, moon stars, whales animals, birds, grass, trees, fruit, herbs, and finally man. God's creation must be and is spiritual. But mortals have identified these names with their own mortal conceptions. Science teaches that we must translate these material symbols into spiritual ideas in order to gain the pure, spiritual meaning of creation.

Let me give you a fev of Jesus' symbolic phrases spoken to his disciples, which further illustrate my meaning. "I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abldeth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing" (John 15:5). In other words, without the Christ-idea or spiritual understanding of God, the disciples were dead wood. Referring to spiritual nourishment, Jesus said, "My meat is to do the will of him that sent me" (John 4:34). He likened his ministry to a shep-herd tending his flock. Jesus' mate-rial lifework is symbolized by a

Next, let me give you a few examples of Mrs. Eddy's use of symbolism, which teach the spiritual meaning for which the word stands. There can never be perfect matter. Matter is dust, nothingness. Therefore, there is no Godlike matter—no good matter; matter is in belief only a symbol which stands for something really substantial.

Then, admitting for the sake of argument that the so-called material world about us is but our limited misconception of God's spiritual creation, how shall we study to bring about its transformation or spiritual idealistic meaning?

Well, we can start by taking two verses from the Bible and then follow with their scientific meaning given in Science and Health. I shall read first the twenty-ninth and thirtleth 'verses of the first chapter of Genesis. and thirtieth verses of the first chapter of Genesis. "And God said, Behold, I have

God's creation is wholly spiritual, embracing the important qualities, wisdom, justice, power, purity, holiness, health, and so on, and the lesser qualities of hope, faith, meekness, compassion, honesty, affection, temperance, and humanity.

It is evident to most of us that while we seem to lack the most important qualities are recognized as the quaities of grace and truth which comprise the teachings of Christ Jesus we shall understand his command to love God supremely and our neighbor as ourself.

The forever contemplation of matter is the underlying cause of envyfear, hatred, lust, selfishness, and greed. If hatred, evil passions, selfishness, lust, fear, and greed make the body sick and useless, then forgiveness, faith, generosity, chastity, confidence, patience, and meckness will, through God's law explained in Christian Science, restore it to health and usefulness. 





Fact Finding Boards appointed by Presidents Roosevelt and Truman have said these demands were "devoid of merit" and they were

Now the Firemen's leaders seek to paralyze railroad transportation to compel the railroads to employ a wholly unnecessary additional fireman to ride on diesel locomotives. This scheme is plain

LEADERS OF the Firemen's union have called a nationwide strike starting with four great railroads on April 26. These railroads are the New York Central, Penn-

sylvania, Santa Fe, and Southern.

The union claim that a second fireman is needed on grounds of safety is sheer hypocrisy. Safety has been dragged into this dispute only in an unsuccessful effort to give a cloak of respectability to vicious feather-bedding demands.

After a careful study of the first demands of this union, a Presidential Fact Finding Board on May 21, 1943, reported to President Roosevelt that there was no need for an extra fireman on diesel locomotives.

Again, on September 19, 1949, after a second hearing on the union leaders' demands, a second Board reported to President Truman that: "thoro presently exists no need for an additional fireman . . . upon either the ground of safety or that of efficiency and economy of operation."

> Safety Record of Diesels is Outstandingly Good

Although the railroads accepted the Board findings, the union leaders have brazenly rejected them. They represent that an extra fireman is needed for "safety" reasons. Here's what the Board had to say

on that point: "The safety and on-time performance of diesel electric locomotives operated under current rules have been notably

good . . . "Upon careful arraiysis of the data submitted on safety, we have concluded that no valid reasons have been shown as a support for the Brotherhood proposal under which a fireman would be required to be at all times continuously in the cab of road diesels. The proposal must be rejected.'

The real reason bel Ind these demands is that the union leaders are trying to make jobs where there is no work. In other words, a plain case of "feather-bedding." The railroads have no intention of yielding to these wasteful make-work demands. "The Safety Record of Diesels is Outstandingly Good ..."

Read these excerpts from official reports of Presidential Fact Finding Boards: "The safety record of Diesels is outstandingly good, and it follows that
