For Traffic Record

Connecticut is credited by the National Safety Council with the third lowest traffic fatality rate in the nation for the first 10 months of 1951, according to an NSC report filed with the Connecticut Safety Commission.

Waterbury continues to lead all cities in its population group for the temmonth period. Bridgeport ranks third, New Haven eleventh and Hartford in twenty-first position out of 42 cities listed in the group.

New Britain is top ranking Connecticut city in ints population class, rating sixteenth out of 83 cities reporting. For cities of 25 to 50,000 population, West Hartford is top twenty-inth out of 129 towns re-

Among smaller communities (10-25,000 population) Windham, Wethersfield, East Haven and Derby are listed fatality-free. Ranked by size, they placed in this order: Windham (34), Wethersfield (45), East Haven (46) and Derby (48) out of 140 reporting towns. ast Haven (46) and Derby (48) out 140 reporting towns.

Connecticut's rate of 3.3 traffic eaths per 100 million miles of utomotive travel was surpassed by hode Island with 2.9 and Masschusetts with 3.2 cases. 


