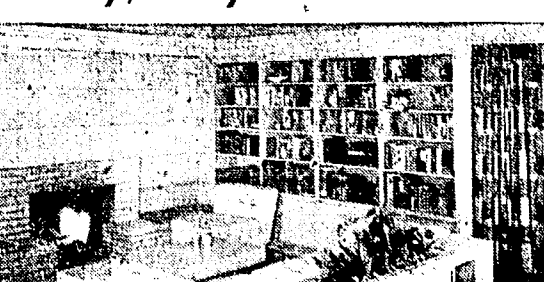

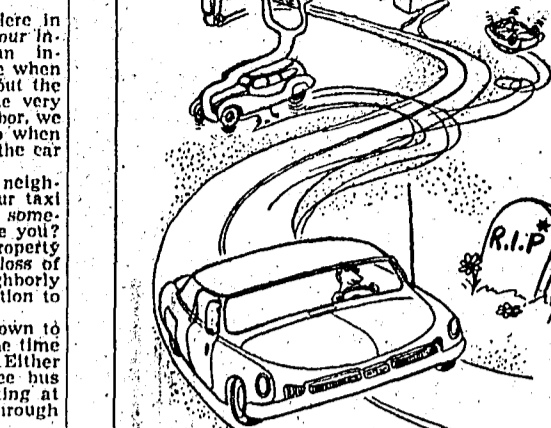
Hop In, Neighbor.
