A proposed school budget totaling \$621,201, or 28.8 per cent higher than for the fiscal year has been submitted to the Board of Finance, John H. Corbett, secretary of the Board of Education revealed this week.

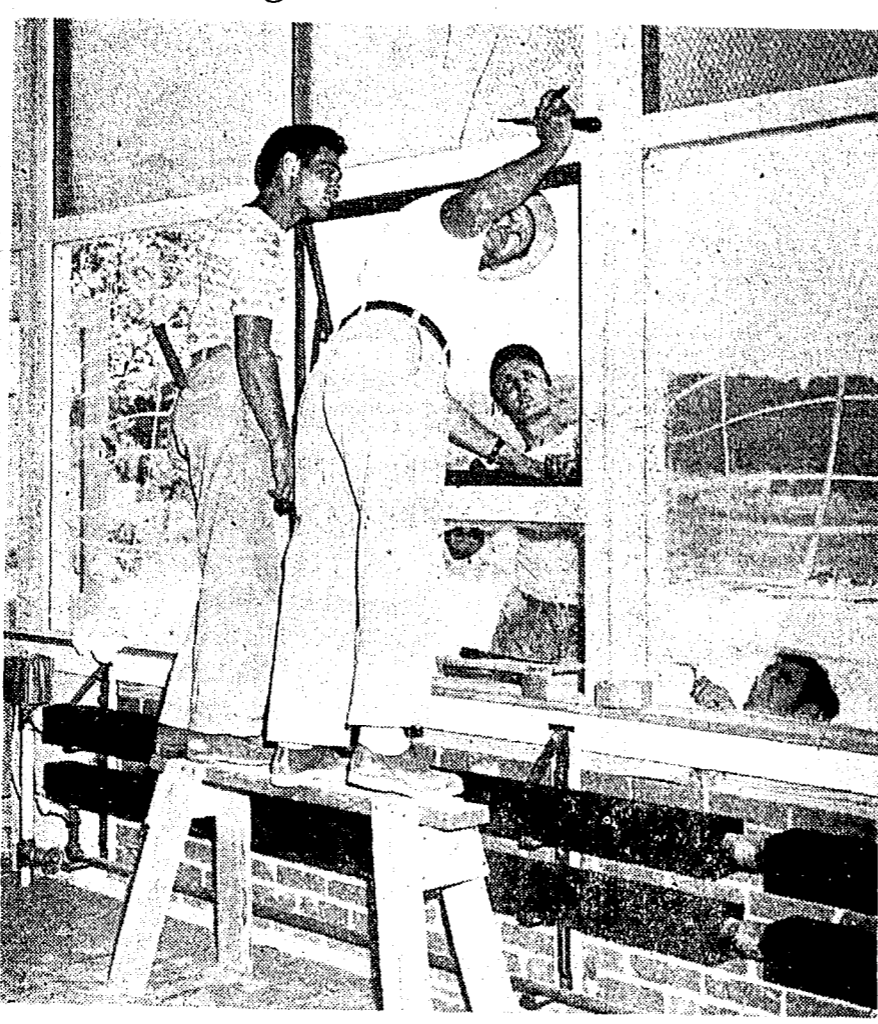
Twin Sisters Dominate Dooley Swimming Meet
