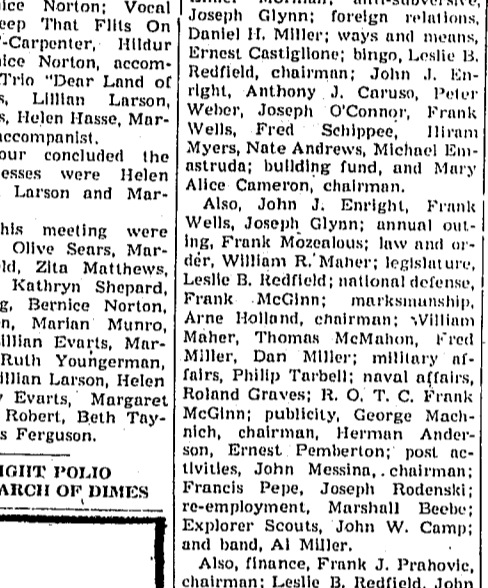

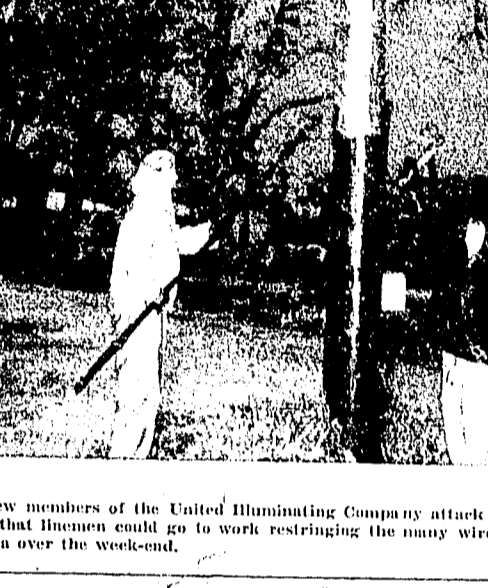

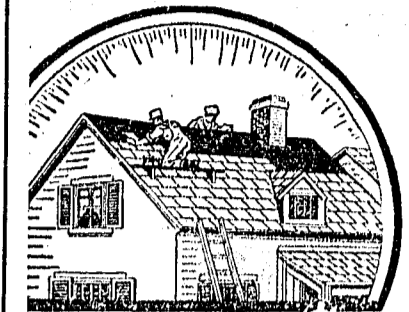
Feb. 5 Deadline For Car Registrations

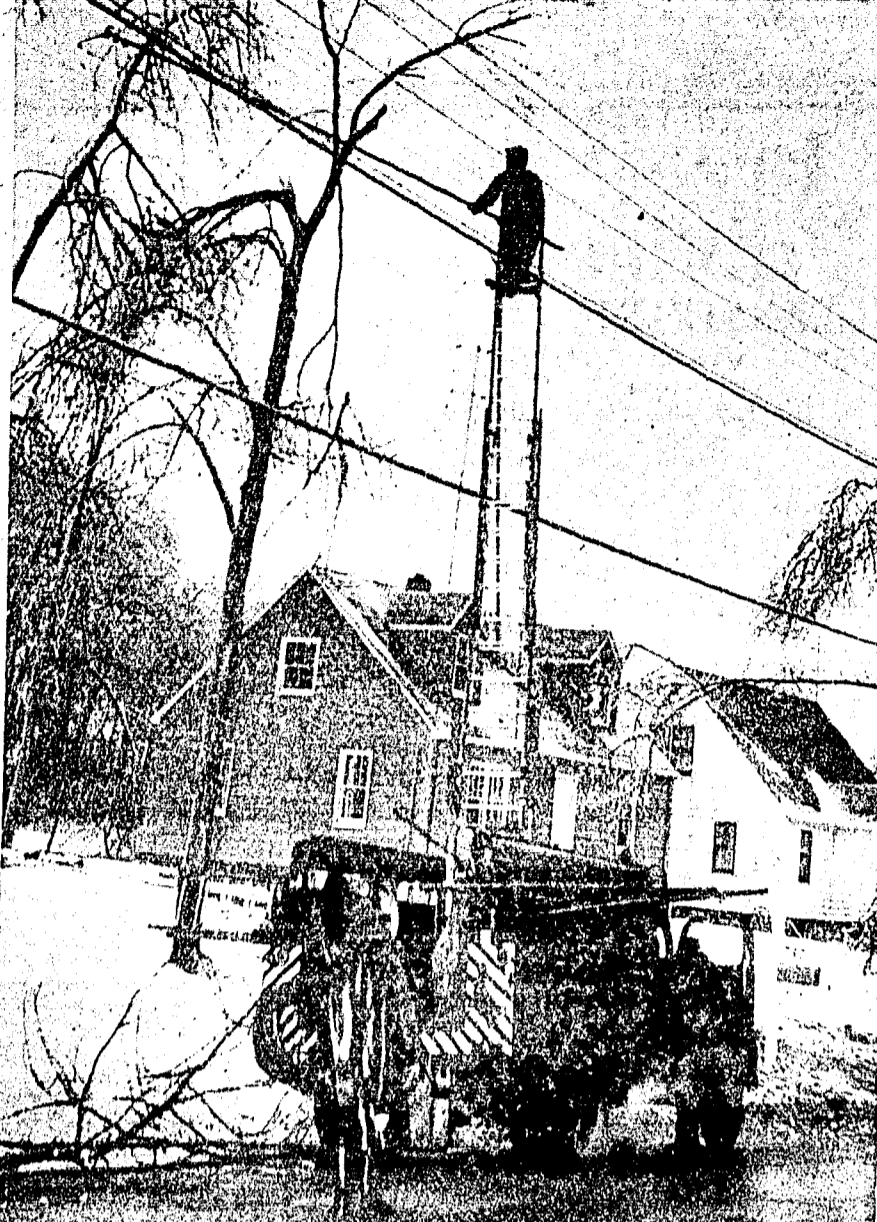

Thirty-One Building Permits Issued During December

Thirty-one building permits including those for the construction of 21 homes at a total estimated cost of \$177,500 were issued during the month of December by the office of Building Inspector Clement Catalano.

Revenues for permits for the month totaled \$955. Besides the 31 building permits which brought fees totaling \$375, the following certificates were issued by the building department during the month:

Five plumbing permits at \$4 each; 22 plumbing permits at \$6 each; 10 street excavation permits at \$1 each and 24 septic tank permits at \$2 each.

Also, one oil tank permit at \$2; four power pump cleanout permits at \$2; 32 licenses to plumbing permits for installation of oil burners, at \$2; 32 license to plumbing contractors at \$5 and one at \$50.

Also, three licenses to electrical contractors at \$5; one at \$10 and one license for oil burner contractor at \$5.

An extra electrical inspection for code violation was made for a fee of \$2.

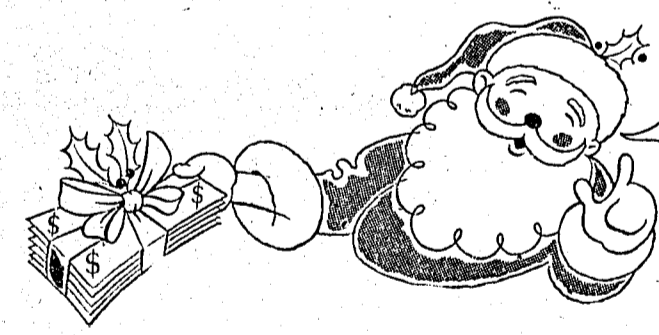
