Bush Is Opposed To Sending Troops To Indo-China War

WASHINGTON, May 27. — U. S. Senator Prescott Bush of Connecticut, said today his "decision to send our military forces to Indo-China would have to be based on a decision that our own security was demonstrably imperiled by the situation there."

The above statements were made in a radio interview by Bush with the Foreign Operations Administration. The interview was recorded for broadcast on the radio over WIC, Hartford, Conn., and later rebroadcast over WELI, New Haven, and WICC, Bridgeport.

In other portions of the broadcast, Senator Bush said that the situation in Indo-China is "one of the most serious in the history of our country."

She plans to enter State Teachers College.

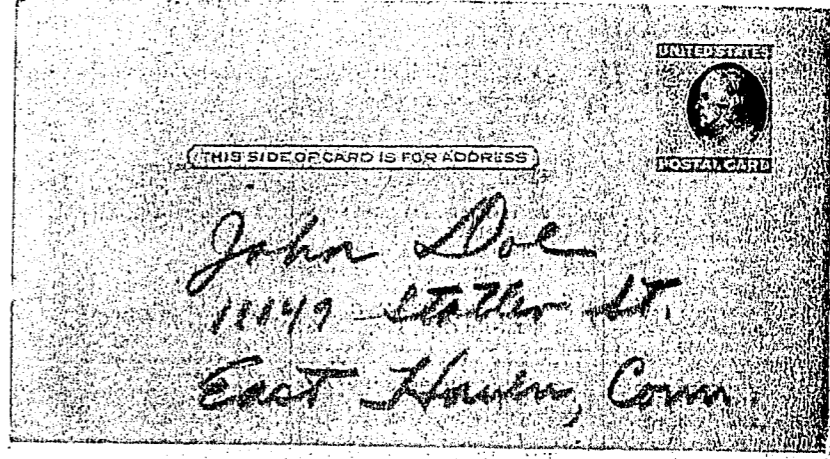
**O.S.C. Progressive Friends To Observe Fifth Anniversary**
