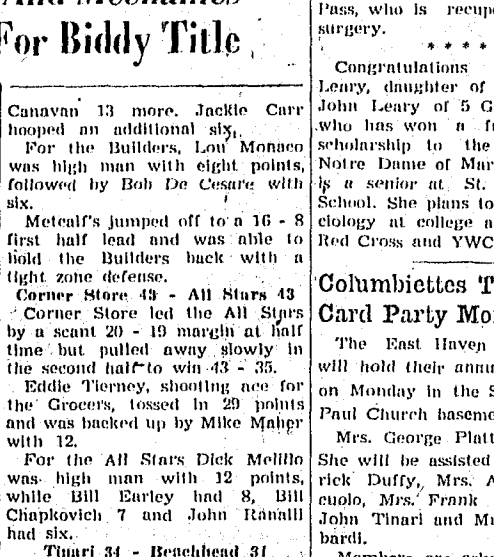

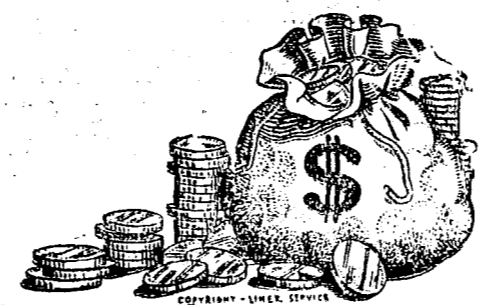

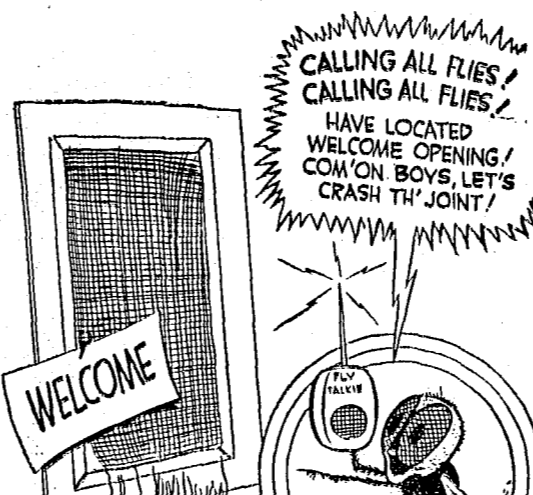

Seventh Grade Visits Peabody Museum, And Reports On Activity

Following a recent trip to the Peabody Museum in New Haven, members of the seventh grade visited the museum and reported on the excursion. Selections from several of the papers turned in were compiled into the report which follows. Contributors from the class were John Aducci, Ralph Barrett, David Germaine, Janet Hallden, Charles Lewis, Edward Paryk and Sally Reif.

"When our class went to the Peabody Museum we saw many interesting things. We saw their rock collection which had many beautiful stones in it. Some of the rocks glowed with bright colors when a black light was turned on and the regular light turned off.

"We saw stuffed birds and other stuffed animals. Then, we saw skeletons of elephants and a skeleton of the famous gorilla, Garfield, which lived in the circus.

"We saw the fossil skeleton of the giant land-robed dinosaur. This great four-footed herbivorous dinosaur is known as the 'Thunder Lizard.' He is 57 feet long and weighs 18 feet over the hips. His live weight is estimated at 40 tons. A dinosaur doesn't have a very large brain so it doesn't think very fast.

"The museum also has a panel of Land Life before the Age of Mammals, a mural painting by Rudolph Zallinger which took four and a half years to complete.

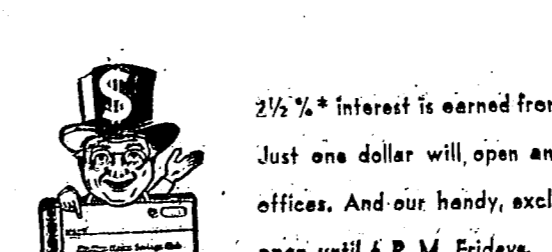

Glastonbury Built Jr.-Sr. High For \$1,426,797

A 267-pupil junior and senior high school was built in Glastonbury for \$1,426,797.52, according to figures released by the Bureau of Field Services of the State Department of Education. Figures were made available locally by Francis Walsh, chairman of the Board of Education.

The Glastonbury school was the least expensive secondary school in a list of eight buildings completed during the first half of 1954. Its \$1,426,797.52 average total cost per pupil compared favorably with an average figure of \$1,948.76 computed for the entire list of eight schools.

All but one of the schools in the list were high schools which tend to be more expensive than junior high buildings.

Here is how the Glastonbury junior-senior high figures were grouped in the main expense categories:

Construction cost	\$1,105,416.54
Equipment	86,889.41
Site development	116,653.73
Arch. Eng. Fees	86,671.30

The Glastonbury school cost an average of \$13.91 per square foot compared to an average of \$15.17 per square foot for the eight schools. Square footage per pupil was low: 88 sq. feet compared to an average of 101 sq. feet.

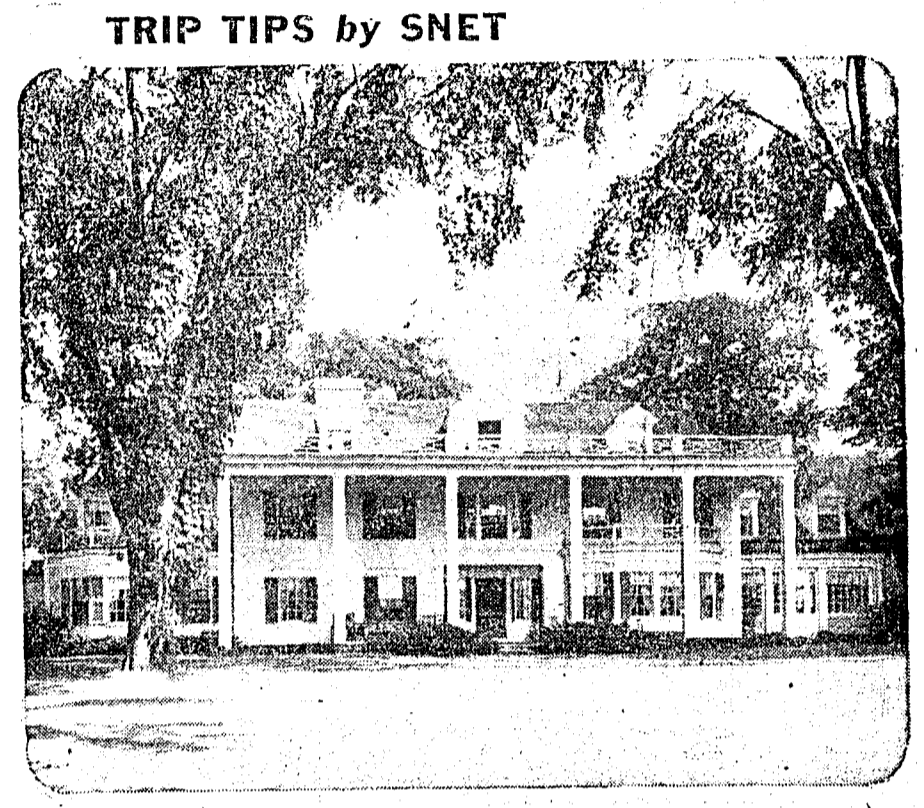

Phillip Cantolara, general chairman, has lined-up what he calls a "stellar show which will be one of the finest ever presented in East Haven."

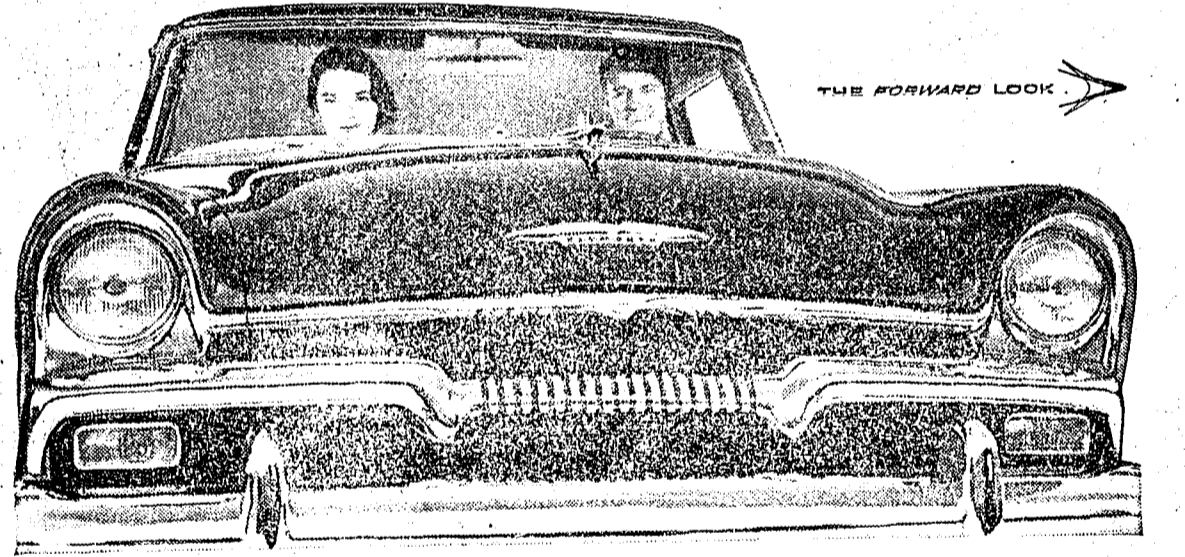
