Yesterday First Selectman Frank Clancy issued a statement that followed on the heels of a blast set off by Third Selectman Frank A. Barker the day before

Clancy claims that in view of the fact that he and Barket could have outvoted Ferrara had they wanted to made his allega-tions "look foolish." Clancy also claimed that Ferrara didn't know the difference between "collusion

and cooperation." Barker in his charges stated that if Ferrara "placed attendance at a dinner above the importance of a regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen, it is his the Weeping Willows Restaurant job to excuse his absence, not to

The Third Selectman also said he believes that Ferrara "deliberately absented himself" in order that he could attack the first steps initiated to see the town's junior high school program under way.

#### Say Store Owner **Continues To Defy Court Decision**

#### Town Counsel Says No Action Taken As Decision Appealed

Several property owners on Gerrish Avenue are incensed be-cause the local court authorities have not seen fit to take action against the proprietor of a near-by store, whom the Court of Common Pleas ruled was barred from operating such an estab-lishment by a ban of the East Haven Planning and Zoning:

Johnson of the Court of Comnon Pleas ruled against Del-Vecchio, dissolved a temporary injunction and ordered him to cease and desist from doing further business. However, Del-Veechlo has to date ignored the court order and is still in busi-

Oren Shorkey, of 31 Gerrish Ave. and Jack Garrity of 25 Gerrish Ave. are now sceking to have DelVecchio conform to the offmmoon Pleas ruling. However, Prosecutor Charles Copeland has not issued a warrant, nor has Richard Reilly, the Town Counsel roquested that one he issued.

Appeals Decision
According to Reilly, the reason he has not brought any punitive action is because Del-Vecchio's lawyer, William F. Geenty, has filed an appeal against Judge Johnson's ruling and is seeking another temporary injunction, which if granted would stay in effect until the supreme Court of Error's ruled on Judge Johnson's decision.

The 50 percent ruling required that, in vie of the fact the building (as an iceliouse) was valued at \$330, DelVecchio was restricted to keep his renovation costs below \$165. The defendant argued that he had renovated the place at \$155, citing that much of the materials had been

donated to him.

However, according to Judge
Johnson, the outlay of cash was
not the criticism since one could build a skyscraper from a chick-encoop at no cost to himself if someone olse supplied the materials, ret the actual cost of the skyscraper would be much greater than 50 percent of the value of the chicken coop.

ers relax their dusting and spraying program. This is a mistake as black spot on roots gains foothold. An all-purpose dust wil keep the foliage clean and plants thriving, Dust zinnias and chrys-anthemums to prevent mildew and watch for late broods of aphids, especially on chrysanthemums and nasturtiums. Nicotine sulphate, such as Black Leaf 40, will give prompt results. The fragrance of rose-geraniums, rather than the insignificant blossoms, is one of the reasons for its popularity. A small plant set out in Spring will have grown by now to a sturdy size with handsome, grey-green, crinkly leaves. A few sprigs will add much to a bouquet. 
