### SUPERVISING SMALL HOME CONSTRUCTION

Plastering may be done in many different ways and with various kinds of material. There is the old fashioned method of slaking the lime in the basement and the use of what is known as old fashioned brown mortar. The hair was mixed by hand and ten days elapsed before the mortar was ready to apply. It makes a good job if applied properly and is still used to some extent.

Modern methods have perfected the ready mixed gypsum plaster such as Adamant (made in New Haven) which has become nationally known and U. S. Gypsum made by The United States Gypsum Co., etc.

These plasters come ready mixed and simply need the addition of water. They come in scratch coats material and finish coat material with full instructions for applying. The material sets in practically 48 hours and speeds up the construction.
