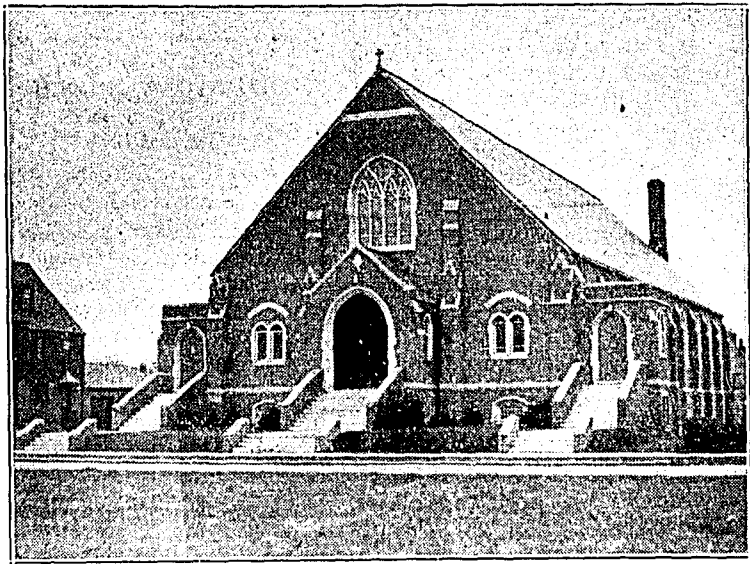

ST. VINCENT'S DEDICATION SCHEDULED FOR SUNDAY

Bishop McAuliffe To Be Present At Rites

The solemn dedication of St. Vincent de Paul's Church will begin next Sunday at 11:00 o'clock. The blessing of the church will be followed by Solemn High Mass. The officers of the mass will be Rev. J. J. Broderick, Celebrant; Rev. Thomas L. Greylish, Kensington, Deacon; Rev. John J. Dillon, Washington, sub-deacon. The preacher will be Rev. Walter McCrann, South Meriden. Special music under the direction of Carrie Fiondella Rastedt will be rendered. The ushers around the exterior of the Church and also the interior, while special at the Mass will be Messrs. William Geenty, Frank Cox, Walter Bussell, William Tomlinson, Henry Weber, Al Doran.

During the blessing of the Church, Most Rev. Bishop Maurice F. McAuliffe of Hartford, in procession with clergy and altar boys pass prayers are said, and is sung the Litanies of the Saints. During the Mass which follows, the Bishop

presides on a throne, and at the conclusion usually addresses the congregation.

Established 1913

The parish of St. Vincent de Paul's was established here in 1913 as St. Michael's Mission by Bishop John J. Nilan, where services were held each Sunday in a room over Beaulac's blacksmith shop in Main Street. On October 19, 1914, Rev. Michael Leo Regan was appointed as pastor of the new parish at which time the original St. Vincent de Paul's church was erected in Main Street. Upon the death of Father Regan in 1916, Rev. Dr. Joseph J. Joyce was appointed to continue the work here who remained for 16 years when he left to become pastor of Holy Trinity Parish, Wallingford. It was at this time that Rev. Jeremiah J. Broderick became pastor of the parish. He has established missions at Momauguin, Short Beach and Morris Cove, and was instrumental in bringing about the new edifice in Taylor Avenue.

The new St. Vincent's Church, recently finished, was begun on April 3rd of last year, and the first Sunday Mass was celebrated on April 3rd this year. The Church is of red brick construction with lime stone trim and has a capacity of about 720. Mr. H. Donald Byrne, architect, designed the new edifice which was constructed by First Selectman James J. Sullivan, contractor.

Other services in this parish on Sunday will be:—St. Vincent's New Church—Mass at 7, 8:30, 10, 11. St. Vincent's Church Main St.—7, 8:30, 11, (Old Church) St. Bernadette's Morris Cove—9, 10:30. St. Elizabeth's—10:00, D. S. T.

On the following Sunday, May 1st Mass will be resumed at Momauguin with service at the Hotel Water Front at 9:30.

Track Team To Compete

East Haven's track fans will be seen traveling the route to Storrs, Conn., tomorrow for there is the site of the Third Annual Connecticut State College Relay Championships. East Haven High will have its classy relay team, the outfit which downed the best in state competition in their first meet at Wesleyan, entered in the 440 yard run. In addition to having their eye on the relay title Coach Tierney has given his boys a chance to crack the unimpressive record of 10.5 sec. for the hundred yard dash, with the entire four men also entered in this event.

The Blue and Gold cinder whizzes will be out to break a jinx acquired in last year's meet, when, while leading Stonington by a full twenty yards, they dropped the baton and were nosed out at the tape. Stonington, by the way, went on to set the existing best time of 47.3 seconds.

The relay team of Captain Ed Bruce, Bob Buechelle, Ted Emmons and Al Bahson are confident of avenging last year's defeat and of showing the other Class B schools that East Haven has a track team to be proud of.

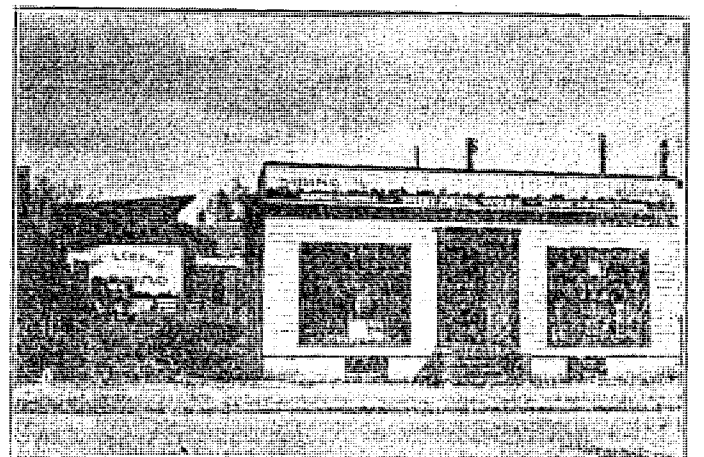
