It will swing off from the present highway and pass under Townsend and Woodward avenues, south of Woodward school, which will not be disturbed as had been considered under preliminary plans. The new highway will then move across the lowlands south of the Annex Fire House, and cross Stiles street and the other north and south roads in that area of the 32nd ward, joining the present highway near the old Tomlinson Bridge.

The relocated highway will have every possible safety feature, according to the state Highway Commissioner. All curves will be gradual, no grade greater than five percent and access and exit ramps will be limited to key locations.

Other links of the new through route through New Haven are more vague, and will take upward of fifteen years to complete. The \$30,000,000 project calls for a new bridge across Quinnipiae River, and a stretch of highway which will skirt New Haven harbor on land now being reclaimed with fill taken from the deepening of New
