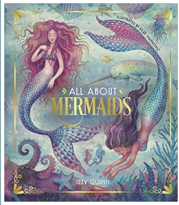
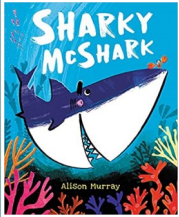

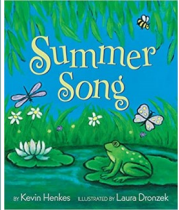
*All About Mermaids* by Izzy Quinn

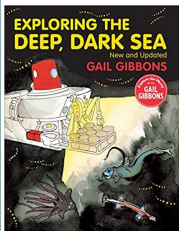
*Sharky McShark* by Alison Murray

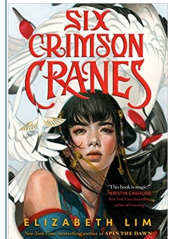
*Rise to the Sun* by Leah Johnson

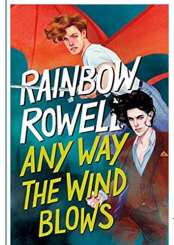
*All Our Hidden Gifts* by Caroline O'Donoghue

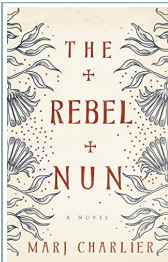

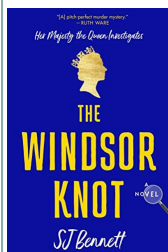

## New in Fiction

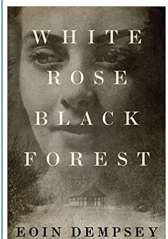
*The Rebel Nun* by Marj Charlier

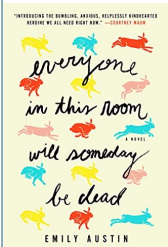
*The Windsor Knot* by S.J. Bennett

*White Rose, Black Forest* by Eoin Dempsey

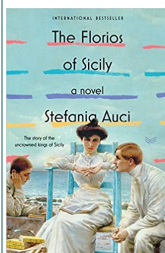

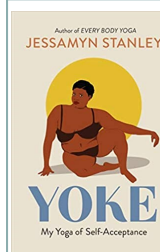
*Island Queen* by Vanessa Riley

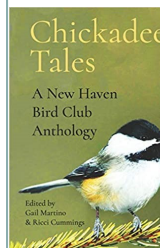
## New in Non-Fiction
